
Te Ranga Mārō is now seeking whānau who:

HE TĀHUHU KŌRERO

He Tāhuhu Kōrero, a programme that brings together internal and external expertise to create a whānau-led pathway for aspirations in homeownership. Over the last 5 years He Tāhuhu Kōrero programme has provided a platform for 10 whānau, supporting them towards their homeownership aspirations.

Tu Ara Ake

In 2019, five whānau in the Manawatū region joined the He Tāhuhu Kōrero programme. They now live in their new urban papakāinga, with three whānau successfully purchasing their kāinga. In 2019, the programme included co-designing the whare, providing whānau with residential, tenancy, and sale and purchase agreements, developing kawa and tikanga, and holding workshops for growth opportunities.

Te Whenua Taketake Ūkaipō

In early 2023, another five whānau began their journey on the He Tāhuhu Kōrero programme. Te Whenua Taketake Ūkaipō whānau attended regular workshops to develop skills and establish Kawa and Tikanga for urban papakāinga living. The 2023 timeline included co-designing the whare, workshops for growth opportunities, and commencing the building phase of Te Whenua Taketake Ūkaipō. In 2024, Kawa and Tikanga were developed, workshops continued, and the whānau are scheduled to move in August 2024.

He Tāhuhu Kōrero Timeline

- He Tahuhu K\u00f6rero Programme begins, 2019 Whānau engage in 6 weekly hui. Jan-Tu Ara Ake **Building Phase** 2020 begins. June-Whānau move into their kāinga. Firstwhānau of Tu 2021 Ara Ake purchase theirkāinga Anothertwo whānau from Tu Ara Ake 2022 purchase their kāinga.
 - Recruitment begins for Awapuni builds.
 - He Tahuhu Körero Programme begins, whānau engage in 6 weekly hui.

Whānau in He Tāhuhu Kōrero will be supported in creating their kāinga and urban papakāinga through a series of engagement phases and with kaimahi from Te Tuahiwi o Te Tihi and external providers.

These are:

Co-Designing Whare

Bringing whānau along the journey in creating their kāinga, whānau can make decisions on the exterior and interior paint colours, fixtures, electric sockets placement and glass placement.

Growth Opportunities

A tailored programme to support whānau in building capabilities and knowledge for homeownership; such as financial knowledge and financial security. 6-weekly hui facilitated by Te Tuahiwi Kaimahi or external providers.

Kawa & Tikanga Development

He Tāhuhu Kōrero Programme helps whānau create a community by building relationships with other future neighbours, connecting to the whenua by learning the whakapapa, and naming the land where kāinga will be built on.



He Tāhuhu Kōrero supports whānau to create Kawa (non-negotiables/core values) and Tikanga (practices) to guide whānau when living as an Urban Papakāinga.

Shared Space

Each Urban Papakāinga will have a shared space defined by whānau. Its maintenance will be outlined in whānau kawa and tikanga.
