Of note is that Taranaki settlements throughout the motu, we Iwi will also have the right to appoint congratulate Taranaki Iwi who signed a two representatives onto Deed of Settlement with the Crown on committees of the Taranaki Regional September 2015 settling their Council. outstanding historical Treaty claims.

settlement includes redress of \$70 million, along with the and 14 deeds of recognition. vesting of 29 sites of cultural significance to be vested in Taranaki Iwi. This includes a joint vesting of the Ngā Motu/Sugar Loaf Islands to Te Ātiawa.

Taranaki Iwi also have a deferred right of selection for two years over 29 commercial properties, and a right of first refusal over all Crown-owned land

The Deed of Settlement also provides financial for 25 statutory acknowledgements

Heretaunga-Tamatea support Settlement

Following the initialling of the He Toa regional development. Māori boarding Takitini Deed of Settlement and recent school, Te Aute College, will also Tamatea have voted overwhelmingly Crown via Heretaunga-Tamatea to the in support of the Deed of Settlement, sustainable future of the kura. which includes compensation of \$100 million.

The ratification results, which were released on 3 September 2015, showed 96.5% of those that voted were in favour of the settlement.

Currently about 7,000 people are registered with He Toa Takitini, which estimates that to be about 25 percent of the Heretaunga-Tamatea population.

As part of the settlement, the iwi plans to give each marae \$1 million in the hope that they will be able to set up for their future in the post settlement settlement. phase.

Of the \$100 million, the intention is to put \$50 million in a central governance body. An additional \$25 million is to go to around 23 marae (as above) and the rest will go to a model targeted at
